Shum’s love of music, led to establishing the *Harmony Ringers* handbell ministry. Rev. Shum was proud to serve as a volunteer Oakland Police Chaplain, and was always willing to share his advice with other pastors, and his parishioners.

As Elder, teacher, and Sunday School Superintendent at CPC of Oakland, Bob frequently taught his favorite scripture of Matthew 25:14-30, ***The Parable of the Talents***.

the US Air Force, earning the rank of Lieutenant Colonel, while also devoting his life to education as a teacher and administrator in the Oakland Unified School District for more than 35 years. As a volunteer, he served on the Board of the Shoong Foundation, and was an active lifetime Wa Sung Service Club member, thereby sharing his talents to help the community.
